



CGS Course Selection Guide for 2017-18

FOR 2017-18, CGS WILL MEET ITS 900-HOUR-PER-STUDENT GOAL IN 4 WAYS:

1. New required semester classes for grades 9 and 11 in 2017-18
2. New required semester classes for grades 9-12 in 2018-19
3. CGS-only sections of classes
4. CGS/BMHS co-seated classes

8 THINGS YOU NEED TO KNOW FOR CGS COURSE REGISTRATION FOR 2017-18

1. **Current 10th graders** must register for 2 new CGS classes:
 - a. Contemporary World Issues (semester of history credit) OR IB History
 - b. Philosophy of Thought (semester of history credit) OR IB Theory of Knowledge
 → FYI: All CGS seniors will be required to take a Capstone course (0.5 credits) beginning 2018-19.
2. **Current 9th graders** must, at some point in the next 3 years, register for:
 - a. Cultural Perspectives in Art--UNLESS you fulfilled your art requirement in 9th grade
 - b. Comparative Religions OR AP Comparative Politics OR IB History (Y1)
3. **Current 8th graders** must register for:
 - a. World Literature 1
 - b. Survey in World History
 - c. Chinese/Japanese/Arabic 1
 - d. World Language Seminar (semester of language credit)
 - e. Cultural Perspectives in Art (taken either grade 9 or grade 10)

FOR ALL STUDENTS

4. All IB classes count towards CGS credit. Enroll in these as if they were AP classes—choose based on your interests and skills. (If you are in the IB Diploma Program, follow our IB course selection guidelines in google classroom.)
5. During online course selection, all students should register for CGS SECTIONS of Math, Science, History, Computer Applications, Health, and PE courses. Each subject has a DROP DOWN MENU. Choose the CGS Section of the following courses:

Here's how we're making it work with the state:

6. After course selection, guidance and Ms. Parham will be creating additional CGS sections based on what you have expressed interested in. For example, if 28 CGS students want to take AP Comparative Politics, then we will create a CGS section of AP CoPo.
7. After course selection, guidance and Ms. Parham will be relabeling certain classes as “co-seated” classes. For example, if 14 CGS students want to take Child Development, we will “co-seat” a section of Child Development. CGS students in that section will have some sort of “global” assignment, and that will count towards your 900 hours of CGS credit.
8. There may be a few electives that do not count for CGS credit. If any individual is short “CGS credit,” guidance and Ms. Parham will work with you individually to figure it out.
